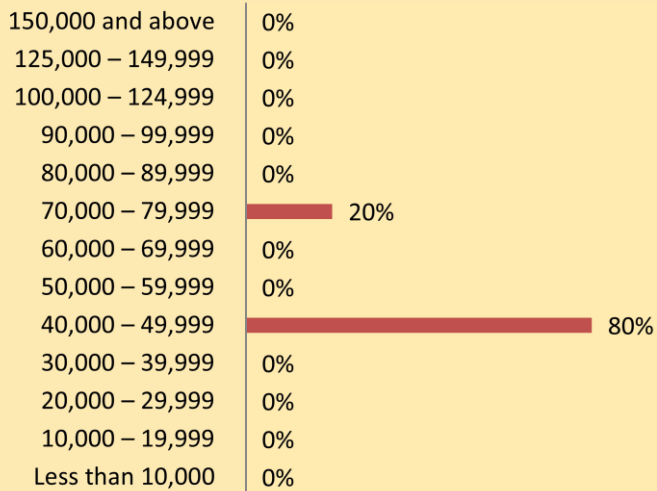
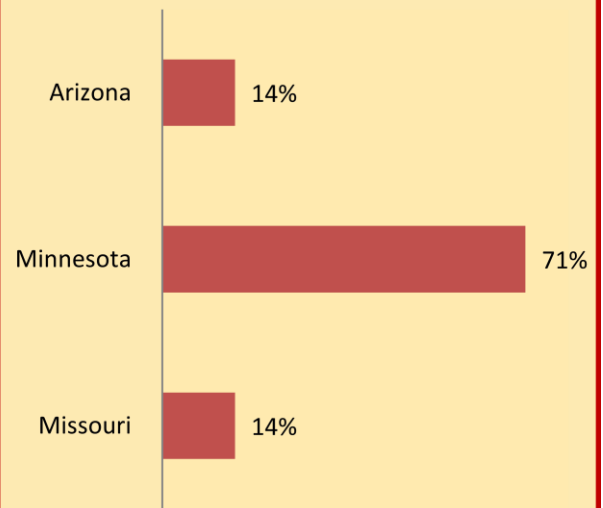


PHM Salary Levels



Positions by State

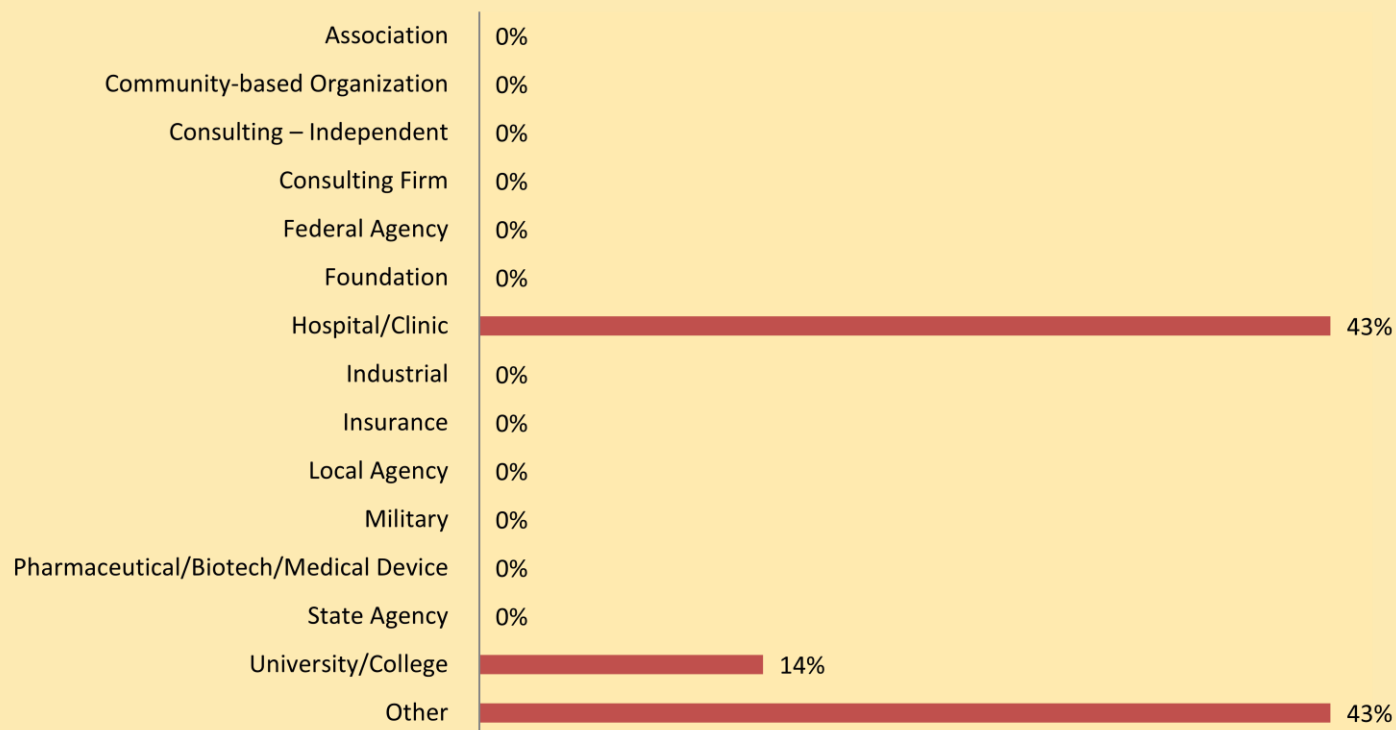

JOB OUTLOOK

- The Public Health Medicine MD/MPH program allows current medical students to combine their studies with a public health degree that will increase their understanding of population-based science and the cultural and environmental factors that affect patients.
- The major in Public Health Practice brings together the science and the art of public health, and addresses public health as a broad social enterprise that seeks to extend the benefits of current knowledge in ways that will have the maximum impact on the health status of populations.
- These academic programs (at the master’s level) prepare students to be leaders and practitioners in the application of public health principles in agencies delivering preventive health services and public health programs. The major emphasizes the importance and applications of basic scientific knowledge to current societal problems and concerns.
- Types of Jobs: Pediatrics, Rural Health, International Non-Profit Agencies, Local Non-Profit Agencies, and Surgery.
- Public health medicine is the specialty, which deals with the medical aspects of public health practice, and is described as "the art and science of improving the community's health through the organized efforts of society".
- Public health physicians tend to deal with the populations health needs rather than those of individual patients. Consultants in public health medicine work with colleagues in other disciplines and undertake many responsibilities. They tend to have a special interest in one of the following areas:
 - Communicable disease control and environmental health.
 - Primary care issues, e.g. public health support to primary care trusts.
 - Clinical governance and evidence based medicine.
 - Planning and information management.
 - Academic public health, e.g. epidemiological research, critical appraisal and systematic review of evidence.
 - Directing or leading local public health departments.
